<p style="text-align: center;">WRITE A BOOK REVIEW</p> <p>Ensure children accurately punctuate their sentences. Discuss ideas for descriptive phrases that children could use to add extra detail.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">READ A MAGAZINE ARTICLE. WRITE: 3 NEW THINGS YOU HAVE LEARNT. 2 THINGS YOU WANT TO RESEARCH. 1 THING YOU LIKED ABOUT IT.</p> <p>Provide articles that your child might find interesting. Read the text together. Explain any unfamiliar words. Discuss ideas for the questions together.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">DESIGN YOUR OWN BOARD GAME. WRITE INSTRUCTIONS TO EXPLAIN HOW TO PLAY.</p> <p>Discuss games that children like to play and ideas that they can take from this to create their own. Talk about the layout and features of instructions.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">DRAW A PICTURE OF YOUR FAVOURITE ANIMAL. CREATE A FACT FILE TO SHARE WITH A FRIEND.</p> <p>Discuss what different resources could be used depending on what is available, for example: paint, pencils or collage. Discuss where/how to find facts.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">CHOOSE YOUR FAVOURITE FAIRY TALE AND WRITE AN ALTERNATIVE ENDING.</p> <p>Talk about what needs to be included in the story. Talk about different endings and how the events could be changed.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">WRITE A POEM ABOUT TODAY'S WEATHER. USE SIMILES AND PERSONIFICATION.</p> <p>Look outside the window and discuss what the weather is like. Compare it to other things using as and like. Try to use similes that give the weather human characteristics</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">FIND OBJECTS IN THE HOUSE CREATE ALLITERATIVE SENTENCES.</p> <p>Children to write a sentence about each object, starting as many words as they can with the same letter. For example: Dad delays doing dirty dishes.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">WRITE A REVIEW OF YOUR FAVOURITE MOVIE.</p> <p>After watching their favourite movie, write a review to encourage other children to watch it. Think about the plot and the best points.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">INTERVIEW AN ADULT. ASK THEM ABOUT THEIR LIFE. WRITE THEIR AUTOBIOGRAPHY.</p> <p>Encourage children to ask good questions, identifying the key information and recording notes using bullet points.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">DRAW YOUR OWN COMIC STRIP.</p> <p>Include the use of capital letters, full stops and correct punctuation for speech bubbles.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">MAKE A POSTER OF 5 WORDS YOU FIND TRICKY TO SPELL.</p> <p>Put the tricky part in a different colour. Discuss any unusual spelling patterns. Can you write these words out in alphabetical order?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">DESIGN A QUIZ.</p> <p>Can you write 15 questions about a river? Think of all the key words you could use? e.g. What is the beginning of a river called?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">WRITE A STORY USING A FAMILIAR HERO. IN YOUR STORY, THEY'RE NOW THE BADDIE.</p> <p>Discuss some heroes they might know. What could happen to make them bad?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">ADJECTIVES, ADVERBS AND VERBS.</p> <p>Read a page from a book. Can you make a list of all the adjectives, adverbs and verbs you come across?</p>
